East End Refugee Committee End of Year Report for 2017

Sponsorships

January – August: We continued our joint sponsorship with the Federal Government of Mustafa. Mustafa is originally from Sudan and lived in a refugee camp in Indonesia for five years. He is studying English and working part-time as a dishwasher.

July: We welcomed the arrival of Bituru, sister of Busha (sponsored in 2015). She is originally from Ethiopia having fled her home country to live in South Africa. She is currently studying English.

August: We concluded our sponsorship of Mustafa and formally recognized the end of the sponsorship with a farewell dinner at a restaurant.

December: Khadija Muradi (sponsored in 2008) and her family welcomed a new baby, Noah, into their family.

The Committee has received news that Badatu, daughter of Busha, will be arriving here sometime within the next 4-6 weeks.

Documents

The EERC's Purpose and Responsibilities document was updated and revised by a subcommittee. The motion to accept this document was passed.

A Memorandum of Understanding between Kingston Rd. United Church and the EERC was passed although discussion regarding this document has continued throughout the year.

Eastminster United Church has decided to withdraw from the EERC as they are actively involved in their own refugee sponsorship work.

Fundraising

The Committee did not host any fundraising activities in 2017. The EERC greatly appreciates the generous donations from various members of our faith communities. A benefit concert is being planned for 2018. *Lee Beard, Chair of the EERC*

Ganaraska Woods Retreat Centre 2017

No hot water! As I watched the repair man work, a successful local tradesman in his late 40s, he remarked, "I'll always remember this place. I was here when I was a kid with my teen group from Port Hope." Sometimes we forget how many lives, outside our own church, have been influenced by events held at our retreat center over the last 42 years. Since its inception, Ganaraska Woods has focused on its two primary reasons for its existence: to provide facilities so that our fellow Christian churches may hold productive group retreats, and to grow our own church family through opportunities for social times together as well as times for learning and worship.

The past year saw an increase in the use of our buildings and grounds which is reflected in the increase in our income. However, the increased income was more than offset by higher costs and necessary capital projects. We replaced half the roofing on our main building and found it necessary to excavate, and seal the western foundation wall of the "Ora Sneyd" Lodge. As always we do depend on donations to cover our operating costs from year to year.

The unusually wet spring and summer meant that our extensive ground needed more than the usual care and cutting. Glen and Terry have done much of this work under Brian's direction. Our mowers, pool, tractor, truck, snow blowers, and ATV all have to be serviced and ready for use each year. Brenda does an admirable job keeping our lodge clean, but we need volunteers to help with painting, decorating and minor projects.

Led by Cynthia, our cooking team of Don, Shawn, and Brenda provide most of the meals for the majority of the groups who do not wish to prepare their own food. They are ably assisted by Marita, Darleen and other volunteers on occasion, but we always welcome more help.

Thanks to Scott we have a new sign out on Count Road 9 which we hope will not only help our guest find us, but also remind people who drive by of our existence and purpose.

The Commission realizes that not all Calvary members can find time to become directly involved in the day to day operation of Ganaraska Woods, but we very much value everyone's prayers and support as we continue to direct this worthwhile work.

- Find an opportunity to get to know someone new in the congregation by inviting them home for lunch or out for coffee.
- Offer to help out the Pastoral Care team in an official capacity. We could use helpers to organize mailings at Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas and to make calls and visits.

Financial Team Highlights

Our financial picture for the year ended December 31 reflects progress on our aspiration to be a good neighbor and to use our space wisely. In March we regretfully saw our arrangement with Shiloh Baptist Church come to a conclusion, however we have gladly welcomed some former Shiloh members into our congregation. In August this year we entered into a new arrangement to share our sanctuary with the Heavenly Light congregation. This arrangement, combined with greater use of both the Calvary and Ganaraska Woods facilities, represents progress in terms of our goal of achieving long-term financial sustainability. We are grateful that giving by the congregation increased over 8%, a most welcome reversal of a long-term trend. This, along with the new arrangements to share the sanctuary, resulted in an increase in income over 2016 as well as exceeding our income budget for the year.

With respect to expenses, the ongoing search to fill the vacant position of a music director has resulted in lower salaries than expected, with offsetting costs incurred for music supply. With respect to facilities costs, while we had savings on utilities through the year, in part due to the warm winter, we continue to face challenges maintaining our aging buildings. During the year, repairs to the church buildings, including much needed improvements to the wheelchair access ramp, repairs to the boiler and some windows resulted in higher facilities maintenance costs than expected. Overall, expenses are over budget and higher than the prior year, mainly due to higher facilities costs. In total, we incurred a deficit, which will reduce our reserves.

When Pastor David McCleary joined Calvary in 2016 we made the difficult decision to hire him on a part-time basis in order to live within our financial means. However, we continue to seek creative ways to increase our ministerial capacity. To that end, we were successful in receiving approval for grants from CBOQ and TBM for funding for a part-time youth and family pastor for 2018 and 2019. We are excited about the opportunity to better serve youth and families in our congregation and the greater Beach community.

The 2017 Financials & 2018 Budget will be published separately prior to the January 28th Huddle.

Report of the Stewardship and Fundraising Team – For the past year we have concentrated our efforts in the following areas: **Special Events** – Music on Main events, Christmas Fair, Treasure Find (in the parking lot in June); **Planned Giving** – Remembering Calvary in your will, with an insurance policy, or with a gift of stock certificates; **Regular Giving** – Can you increase your regular giving by 10%? We have new ways to help make it easy; **Rental of Space**.
