# Spotlight

### Love ... Nothing but Love ...

A new season is upon us in Matthew 28:18-20 ... <sup>18</sup> Jesus (spoke to his followers saying) ... "I've received all authority in heaven and on earth. <sup>19</sup> Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to obey everything that I've commanded you. Look, I myself will be with you every day until the end of this present age."

Fall is here. It is a new season when we say goodbye to summer. And in this change of season, we cast our minds forward to the coming cold and darkness – "winter is coming." But like many this time of year, the Fall can be hard. And it can be a time that fills many with sadness in the face of these new realities. But even in the face of these new realities, there are still many blessings that have only been revealed because of this new season of change. We are so blessed to live in this city of trees, we are also still fortunate in spite of ever increasing size, to still have semi wild places, like ravines in our neighbourhoods. So whether it is in our new floors, new programs or new relationships and partnerships, our newly repaired fence, or our new staff, they all reveal our commitment to being the loving disciples God is shaping us to be. And in carefully attending to the beauty and vibrancy that God is revealing in us, we put the lie to the common story that the church has no story, no life and no future unless we continue to stick to what we have always known. Instead of just seeing in the changing of season, loss, darkness and dreading the cold new realities which beset us, we instead choose to trust in the love of God at work in us and all around us, and more so than we ever have before, see the opportunity to be something new and different guided by His love. And so we go forward together, not dreading what's to come, but rather, looking forward with expectancy and hope to God revealing in us more of His love, and, with excitement, God showing us how to be more about what new expressions of love He is calling us out into our community, as a church family, as a result. #### **Results to September 30**

The financial statements for the nine months show a deficit of \$8.2k, as budgeted. Income overall has exceeded budget and the prior year. Key highlights of income variances are as follows:

- Envelope giving has flattened so is equal to the prior year, but is lower than budget. While plate and other giving has sustained, overall we are in an under budget situation for giving.
- Other income (primarily rental) is tracking to budget, due to the
  fact that Heavenly Light has been contributing \$200 per week
  plus out-of-pocket costs for our youth ministry since June, which
  was not anticipated in the budget. This is offset by other rental
  income falling below budget, as it is taking some time to increase
  the rental use of our facilities. Overall, rental income (excluding
  Leroux) is almost double the amount from the prior year.
- Grant funds for our emerging youth ministry include amounts from CBOQ. TBM. Canada Summer Jobs and the Mustard Seed Foundation.

Expenses are slightly over budget for the first nine months, with a number of variances:

- Facilities savings on natural gas were redirected to maintenance for fence and parking lot repairs while still being below the overall budget year-to-date.
- Ministry Support funds budgeted for communications have not been spent, resulting in under budget for ministry support, while office supplies are over due to costs related to new employees (laptops). The net savings will be redirected to youth ministry or salaries.
- Worship Team costs include a higher amount for pulpit supply due to the late start of the Minister of Music (offset by lower salary costs).

- Christian Education and Outreach includes direct costs related to the youth ministry (excursions, supplies, etc.) which are funded by grants, support from the congregation, and cost sharing with Heavenly Light.
- Pastoral Care includes worship supplies and ministers expenses, nominally over budget due to professional development expenditures for ministry staff.
- Finance and Stewardship includes HST costs (net of rebate)
  related to the building improvements and will exceed budget
  due to the extraordinary expenditures incurred for building
  improvements over the summer.

#### **Building improvements & Insurance Claim**

Over the summer months, capital costs incurred for roof repairs, flooring and carpet totaled \$33,922 (before HST, 70% of which is refunded, as well as the insurance claim), and a net of \$27,665 after the insurance claim of \$12k for roof and ceiling damage incurred during the spring storm. There was no deductible for the insurance claim. The congregation approved up to \$35k for these expenditures in June, which are reflected on the balance sheet under Capital Fund.

#### **Bequest**

In April of this year we received notice that Calvary is the beneficiary of a bequest of \$100k from the estate of Margaret Kennedy, a long-time congregation member. The use of funds is restricted, in that the principal amount is to be held in perpetuity, with income from the investment to be used for pastoral care in the Toronto community, including community outreach activities. To date, \$98k of shares has been transferred from the estate to a Calvary investment account, with the remainder to be received soon. The yield on the portfolio of shares transferred is 3.725%. I would like to establish a committee to update the investment policy and review investment performance. Volunteers may contact the office or the treasurer directly. Heather Mains, Treasurer
